This is a city that is unashamedly pro-growth and uniquely placed to deliver on the Government's #1 mission of national economic growth.


Located at the geographical centre of the Oxford-Cambridge corridor, we are the only UK city purposely designed with business growth in mind.



Designation as a New Town

Milton Keynes' success is firmly built on its New Town roots and the opportunities that created for the city and the residents and businesses that were created or moved here.

To maximise the opportunities for the city and to help meet the Government's missions, we strongly believe that **Milton Keynes** should be once again at the forefront of the Government's new wave of New Towns.

We know from experience that major growth requires significant focus and support to ensure it provides the benefits of growth for both existing and future residents.

Within our city centre and through further extension of the city east of the M1 motorway, and with the right powers, funding regimes and delivery arrangements through the New Town programme, we believe our housing targets could be delivered faster.

These strategic development sites are ready to go now and identified in our emerging MK City Plan 2050. In the longer term, developers in other parts of the city are gearing up for even more growth beyond this. Our aim is for Milton Keynes to be identified as a priority focus in the New Towns Taskforce report later in 2025, and for MHCLG to take forward their recommendation

A University and Innovation Quarter for Milton Keynes

Milton Keynes has a dynamic, innovation-led economy and is at the heart of the Oxford-Cambridge Growth Corridor.

We are working with key partners including His Majesty's Government Communications Centre (HMGCC) to develop an Innovation Quarter, with a focus on technology and national security. The Innovation Quarter will be the flagship for tech and innovation in our city.

We also intend to strengthen the Higher Education presence in CMK, to further accelerate innovation.

Milton Keynes is already home to the Open University, once of Europe's largest universities, with **200,000** students and a leading innovator in digital learning. Cranfield University is also based just outside the city, offering worldclass R&D in science, technology, engineering and management.

We believe the time is now right to establish a new city-centre undergraduate university in **Milton Keynes**. As the city continues to grow this is essential to strengthen the supply of highly skilled graduates for local employers.



Milton Keynes is the largest town or city in the UK without an undergraduate residential university. We firmly believe that the benefits to our city of undergraduate education presence will be transformational.

These include attracting new and supporting existing businesses, improving our skills base and providing new education options locally, bringing new activity and vitality to the city centre, and expanding our cultural offer.

We continue to work with the Open University and other potential partners about a city centre Higher Education presence.

We are interested to explore the potential for a multi-university model and would be keen to talk to other institutions about the opportunities for shared facilities and providing a diversity of offer for students.



We have the space and ambition to make a Higher Education-led Innovation Quarter a reality.


The next step is to secure the investment needed to drive the project forward. **Devolution for Milton Keynes** and its region -A Mayor for BLMK (Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes)

Devolution has a critical role to play in unlocking growth. By focussing on economic development, housing, planning, transport, infrastructure and future delivery of public services at a regional level, there is a clear opportunity to tackle barriers to growth and improve delivery for local people.

It is vitally important that Devolution is on a footprint that make sense to local people and businesses. For Milton Keynes, this footprint covers the four local authorities within Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes¹² – or BLMK.

The BLMK economy already contributes £32.9bn to the national economy. The area is home to over 1 million people and is one of the fastest growing regions in the country.
