South Midlands Growth Hub launches £1.8 million growth grant programme



The new grant funding programme has been created to accelerate the growth of South Midlands SMEs by driving innovation, advancing local economic priorities and supporting the region's decarbonisation ambitions.

The South Midlands Growth Hub has launched the South Midlands Growth Grant, a £1.8 million, to be awarded over three-years designed to empower SMEs, micro-enterprises and sole traders.

Eligible businesses across Bedfordshire, Luton, Milton Keynes and Northamptonshire can apply for grant funding between £300 - £50,000 to support investments in innovation, adoption of new technologies and enhancement to green credentials.

Ruth Roan, South Midlands Growth Hub Manager: "The launch of the South Midlands Growth Grant is a significant moment for our business community. Our micro-businesses and SMEs are at the forefront of business growth, and we must provide a platform to ensure their growth can accelerate.

"Our ambition is to help businesses maximise their strengths, create business resilience and generate sustainable growth. We're excited to launch the South Midlands Growth

Grant and to see the impact it has on our region."

Businesses interested in applying for the South Midlands Growth Grant are invited to submit an Expression of Interest to the Growth Hub, outlining the project and the amount of funding required. The deadline for Expressions of Interest is 17:00, 17 December 2025.

Thousands of comments help shape MK City Plan 2050



Milton Keynes City Council has published the next stage of its long-term vision for growth, the Milton Keynes City Plan 2050, following thousands of comments from residents, businesses and community groups that have helped shape the plan so far.

The MK City Plan sets out how Milton Keynes can deliver new homes, attract investment, and create well-connected communities with access to schools, health services, shops,

and green spaces, while protecting the environment and ensuring infrastructure is in place from the start.

Since 2023, the city council has run a wide-ranging engagement programme, including inperson events and an online campaign, which attracted around 7,000 comments. This stage allowed people to share views on how the city should grow, and their feedback has been instrumental in shaping the policies now included in the plan.

The process is now moving into a formal and technical stage. Before the plan is submitted to government for independent examination, the city council is inviting comments specifically on whether it is legally sound, based on robust evidence, and consistent with national planning policy. Anyone who wishes to comment on these aspects or suggest changes to ensure compliance with national requirements can do so by 22 December (5:30pm).

City Council invites local businesses to join free sustainability programmes



Milton Keynes City Council is calling on local businesses to seize the opportunity to cut costs, boost efficiency, and lead the way on sustainability through two fully funded programmes.

The initiative is supported by the **UK Shared Prosperity Fund, administered by Milton Keynes City Council**, which invests in projects that strengthen communities, create jobs, and grow local economies. As part of this commitment, £35,000 has been allocated to **Green Lark**, a local sustainability consultancy dedicated to helping businesses reduce energy use and prepare for a low-carbon future.

Greenlark is delivering two schemes:

- Sustainable Business provides practical tools and expert guidance to help businesses measure their carbon footprint, identify emissions sources, and take action to reduce them. Cutting energy and resource use doesn't just benefit the environment it saves money, improves efficiency, and builds resilience for the future.
- Carbon Literacy for Business is an accredited training course running on 2 and 3
 December. It equips businesses and their teams with the knowledge and confidence to act on climate change, while earning an internationally recognised Carbon Literacy certification. This training helps organisations understand climate impacts and implement solutions that reduce costs and demonstrate leadership.

Both programmes are **completely free** for Milton Keynes businesses and form part of a city-wide ambition to make the city a leader in sustainability.
